3. As entry fee \$5 covers your choice of tea, coffee, soda along with chips and green/red salsa.



Legislative Report

CCRW Legislative Report

REDISTRICTING IS UNDERWAY IN THE 3RD TEXAS SPECIAL SESSION

The special legislative session in which redistricting will be featured formally began Monday, September 20, 2021. Lawmakers will redraw the state's maps for Congress, the Texas House and Senate and the State Board of Education to account for a decade's worth of growth recorded in the 2020 census.

The state's population has swelled significantly in the last decade. Districts are supposed to be equal or, in the case of legislative districts, close to equal in population. On the congressional front, Texas lawmakers must also reconfigure the map to incorporate the two additional seats the state earned because of its growth.

Republicans currently hold 23 of the state's 36 congressional districts, 82 of the state's 150 House seats and 18 of the state's 31 Senate seats, basically controlling the redrawing of the state's maps.

Since 2010, Texans of color accounted for 95% of the state's population growth – about 4 million residents. The state's Asian population grew by 613,092 since 2010; the white population grew by 187,252.

Of the state's 4 million new residents, 44% live in the state's five largest counties which are – Harris, Dallas, Bexar, Travis and Tarrant. They are primarily Democrat voters.

Across the state, districts held by both Democrats and Republicans have grown far beyond their ideal size, while others are significantly underpopulated. Republicans face some complex decision-making if they want to expand their majorities in the statehouse and in Congress while shoring up suburban districts that are among the most overpopulated – some in areas that grew significantly because of growth among people of color.

The Kinney county Sheriff and DPS troopers welcomed the help that was made available because of the insight of Judge Mark Henry and the commissioners court. The Constables' slideshow presentation was very informative about the challenges our state is experiencing in border security. Mary Kennedy introduced our guest speaker Texas Representative Dr. Greg Bonnen. Dr. Bonnen shared his experiences and accomplishments this past session and special sessions. The "Heartbeat Bill" passed and the Supreme Court refused to hear the challenge. The election integrity bill, pension reform and border protection are also wins for Texas republicans. The next special session will address redistricting.
