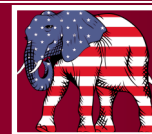

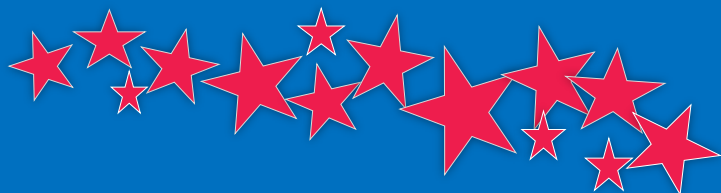

Where Did We Get Constitution Day?

- Constitution Day is an American federal observance set on September 17, the day in 1787 that delegates to the Constitutional Convention signed the document in Philadelphia.
- The law establishing the holiday was created in 2004. Before this, the holiday was known as "Citizenship Day". The act mandates that all publicly funded educational institutions and federal agencies provide education on the U.S. Constitution on that day.

Fascinating Facts

- Because of his poor health, Benjamin Franklin (age 81) needed help to sign the Constitution. As he did so, tears streamed down his face.
- The first time the term "The United States of America: was used was in the Declaration of Independence.
- There have been 500 proposed amendments to change the Electoral College system of electing the president. All failed.
- President George Washington established Thanksgiving Day on November 26, 1789 with the purpose to give "thanks" for the new constitution.
- The U.S. Constitution is the oldest and shortest written Constitution of any major government in the world. (4,400 words)

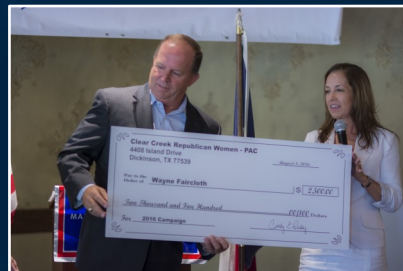
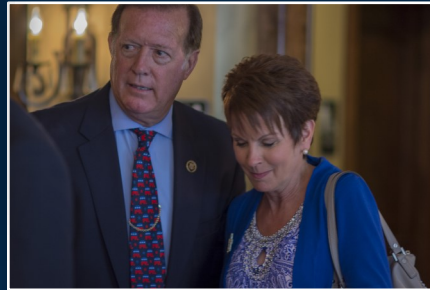
