SREC Committeeman J.T. Edwards and Committeewoman Tanva Robertson


will be in Austin to cast their votes for one of the above candidates on March 7

Our Civil Authority Appointed by God

Scripture teaches about those who are in authority over us. They are appointed by God. They are to be above reproach. We sat in the gallery and watched as the governor laid out his plan for the next 2 years. He identified education as a one of the "emergency issue" and top priority for the upcoming biennial session. Here are some of the things Gov. Abbott wants to do in education: End school finance 1

litigation,

Improve early edu-2. cation by providing additional funding for schools that adopt high-quality Pre-K programs, 3. Allocate more money to Science Technology Engineering Math (STEM) teachers and teachers who work with disadvantaged students, Increase local con-4.

trol of education by allowing school districts to opt out of some of the education code, 5. Elevate Texas

5. Elevate Texas higher education by committing a half billion dollars to enhance research programs and attract nationally-recognized researchers and Nobel Laureates to Texas universities.
