#### UPDATE ON VISA LOTTERY BILL

Here's an action item that represents a place where our calls to our Representatives can help to plug the hole in the dike, where illegal immigrants are flooding into our country. Though it is true that we all descended from immigrants...I'm only second generation from Irish immigrants, on my Mother's side...most of our ancestors came here legally, with the intent to make this country a better place for all to live peacefully. A large number of the Visa Lottery immigrants are here illegally and are intent on our harm. They are here to, eventually, make war with us within our own country. They are using our laws against us. Many came into the US through West Texas and murdered ranchers and stole from people on their way into the country. They don't consider themselves bound by our laws, because they have their own laws by which they abide and consider our law subordinate to their own. If these facts alarm and anger you, below you can discover how you can help fix this mistake in our immigration laws. When the VISA LOTTERY was instituted, I doubt that anyone could foresee foreign nationals coming here to use it to harm us. It's time that the hole in the immigration dike was plugged. Will you help to do so?

#### H.R. 775 Passes Immigration Subcommittee

Next Up, Full Committee Consideration

Your faxes and phone calls in support of Rep. Bob Goodlatte's (R-VA) bill to end the much abused diversity visa lottery program made a huge difference. H.R. 775, the Security and Fairness Enhancement for America Act, passed the House Immigration Subcommittee yesterday by a vote of 5-3. Those voting in favor included Chairman John Hostetler (R-IN), Reps. Jeff Flake (R-AZ), Steve King (R-IA), Melissa Hart (R-PA), and Elton Gallegly. Voting no were Reps. Sheila Jackson Lee (D-TX), Zoe Lofgren (D-CA), and Linda Sanchez (D-CA).

We must now focus on getting the full Judiciary Committee to take up and approve H.R. 775. With Judiciary Committee approval, the bill can be brought to the House floor for a vote.

A phone call can be as simple as saying: "My name is (insert name), I live in the district and I want to urge Rep. (insert name) to press the Judiciary Committee to take up and approve H.R. 775 and to vote YES for H.R. 775 when it comes to the House floor for a vote."

#### **BACKGROUND**

The removal of this controversial program will help ensure our nation's security, make the administration of our immigration laws more consistent and fair, and help reduce immigration fraud and opportunism.

#### TALKING POINTS

THE VISA LOTTERY IS A NATIONAL SECURITY THREAT On July 4, 2002, a gunman entered the Los Angeles International Airport and opened fire. As a result, two innocent people were killed. The killer, Hesham Mohammed Hadayet, was allowed to legally reside in the United States because his wife won the visa lottery.

Most visas are issued to foreign nationals who already have existing relationships with lawful U.S. residents or employers. However, under the visa lottery program, applicants are chosen purely at random, which leaves open the door to those who want to enter the United States to harm our citizens.

## THE VISA LOTTERY IS UNFAIR TO LAW-ABIDING IMMIGRANTS

It's unfair because it treats illegal alien applicants the same as those who abide by our immigration laws. It's also unfair because it pushes 50,000 random immigrants ahead of family and employer-sponsored immigrants, who currently wait many years for visas.

#### THE VISA LOTTERY PRODUCES FRAUD

It is commonplace for foreign nationals to apply for the lottery program multiple times using many different aliases. Many of these individuals are already in the United States illegally. In addition, the visa lottery program has spawned a cottage industry featuring sponsors in the U.S. who falsely promise success to applicants in exchange for large sums of money.

There are already enough problems caused by the Motor Voter Law, under which voting registration is offered to everyone getting a driver's license. This law is in effect even in states that grant driver's licenses to illegal immigrants.

## Book Review

<u>Deliver Us From Evil</u> Sean Hannity

Sean Hannity has written a great follow-up to his first book, *Let Freedom Ring*. This is a timely (meaning don't wait for it in paperback, or it will be dated) and precise text on the means for defeating terrorism, despotism, and liberalism, as the subtitle states. The book is well documented (24 pages of footnotes) and is written with the urgency with which Hannity conducts his weekday radio broadcast (3-6 pm on 740 KRTH and 560 KLVI). Hannity's hypothesis is that evil exists and it is the responsibility of our leaders to discern what is truly evil and eliminate it.

Appeasement is the first mistake in dealing with evil. Liberals seem to forget that it didn't work for Chamberlin, it didn't work for Carter when the Soviets rolled into Afghanistan, and it was still not working for Clinton, when, after the first attack on the World Trade Center in 1993 he urged people not to "overreact". Only when we confronted the evil that was the Soviet Empire did we win the Cold War. Only when we captured Saddam did Qaddafi give up his nuclear capabilities.

The perception, on the left, that conservatives are somehow more dangerous than evil foreign powers, is the second mistake in dealing with evil. In deliberations on the first Gulf War, Nancy Pelosi, D - CA actually worried about the "environmental consequences" of aiding Kuwait. The perception of those outside the West that we, as a nation, have lost our collective courage only serves to embolden those who want to harm us. Reagan understood that the Soviet communist leaders were bent on world domination. Is al Qaeda any different? How did we move from a united nation, immediately after September 11, to a bitterly divided one in only three short years?

Thirdly, irresponsible candidates, such as Howard Dean lead to even more dangerous and irresponsible remarks, such as John Kerry's (now re-edited) statement that "European leaders" are looking for a regime change in the U. S. and that somehow our allies will fall into harmony with us if we have a new Commander-in-Chief. The notion that the war with Iraq was somehow "preemptive", rather than a result of numerous unheeded U.N. resolutions following the Gulf War has worked its way, incorrectly, into much of what is considered "conventional wisdom". As Solzhenitsyn pointed out, when America loses her way that fact puts the whole world in danger.

Hannity suggests that the future will be shaped by the way we treat our allies, such as Israel, Taiwan, Japan, and South Korea, and the way our adversaries, such as China, North Korea, and al Qaeda treat them. To effectively meet these challenges, we must be ready and able to identify evil and elect leaders that have the courage to eradicate it.
