The Texas Ledge...



"Texas families have had to set priorities and make difficult decisions to live within their means.

The introduced budget is a positive sign

that the Texas Legislature is committed to doing likewise," said Talmadge Heflin, director of the Center for Fiscal Policy at the Texas Public Policy Foundation. He served 11 terms in the Texas House of Representatives, and is former Chairman of the Texas House appropriations Committee.

This week, the House of Representatives will take up the state budget, first addressing the shortfall in the current biennium and then taking up the 2012-2013 budget. While our

legislators have been working hard to address the budget shortfall, they are obligated by the constitution to balance the budget. Comptroller Combs informed the Legislature that there would be a \$4 billion shortage of meeting obligations for the 2010-2011 budget cycle. On Monday, members of House Appropriations passed, on a party-line vote, a budget bill. HB 1 was approved 18 to 7 with two members It now goes to the House floor. absent. Appropriations Chairman Jim Pitts Waxahachie) said that he plans to have the budget on the House floor a week from Friday. The budget appropriates \$77.6 billion in general revenue and \$164.5 billion in all funds. Those totals amount to a reduction over the current biennium of \$4.5 billion in General Revenue and nearly \$23 billion in all funds. The budget is broken down into an All Funds Budget which represents all of the money available, state sales tax, federal dollars, dedicated dollars and other dollars. General Revenue Funds Budget are Texas dollars only, made up of sales tax revenues, plus other revenue sources, such as the lottery, motor taxes, oil and gas, tobacco, the business taxes, fees, fines etc, that are either in dedicated funds or the General Revenue. Senator Dan Patrick says that education and health care account for nearly 80% of our budget.

There has been much talk about tapping the Rainy Day Fund. In order to tap the Rainy Day Fund, 90 votes in the House are needed for the \$4.3 Billion deficit and 100 votes would be needed to tap it later to balance the budget that starts in September. The Legislature is not allowed, under law, to appropriate funds beyond 2 years and the current one ends August 31, 2011. The next budget period begins in September for 2012-2013.
