## TEXAS FEDERATION OF REPUBLICAN WOMEN 27<sup>TH</sup> BIENNIAL CONVENTION REPORT

It's hard to believe that just over one year ago we were informed that Galveston had been chosen to host the 2009 Texas Federation of Republican Women's Convention (TFRW). Some of us expressed doubt and wondered if it was even feasible must less possible. After all, Galveston and the entire Gulf Coast had just experienced a devastating hurricane. Questions abounded. Would we be ready in time, could we pull it together and we wondered whether Galveston would even be functional by then? There was so much damage to the infrastructure as well as to all the hotels and other businesses. But, Toni Anne Dashiell, TFRW President, encouraged us to go forward. Every meeting she would say, "We can do it and it'll be fun."

Well, she was right. With the leadership and guidance of Toni Anne and Convention Co-Chairman, Debbie Guitain-Roan, we did it and it was fun and the  $27^{th}$  TFRW Convention held in Galveston, Texas on November 12-15, 2009 is in the history books

Within days after the convention, emails began to fly between all the committee chairmen congratulating each other on a job well done. It began to sound as if we had become a mutual admiration society.

But then I stepped back and looked at each of the ladies and a bigger picture began to emerge. Each one of the ladies is a leader in her own right. Some are businesswomen, some own and run their own businesses, many serve as Republican Women Club presidents or former presidents, some hold leadership positions in their communities, yet, they put aside their title and position, came together and worked as a cohesive team.

Early in our planning meetings we talked about what we, as Republican Women, could do to help the Galveston community. Sally Prill, Off-site Event /Tour Chairman and President, Galveston Women Republican Club suggested we help the Galveston Independent School District Education Foundation replace books for their school libraries. She arranged for the GISD to set up a booth at the convention. During the three day convention many opened up their hearts and pocketbooks and

TFRW presented the GISD Education Foundation with a check for \$4,751.50. Thanks to all of you for reaching out to touch a community that is still recovering.

But, before closing the book completely, I would like to share a few excerpts and thoughts from those who helped and attended the convention.

I think Sally Prill summed up the attitude of all the chairmen and their committees very well.

She said, "I (want to) express my respect for the manner in which you all handled your respective responsibilities during the buildup to the convention. It made the entire planning and execution a pleasure rather than a chore. Very few egos were evident and it all just worked and it was all done by volunteers!"

And these commitments from Kathy Rogers, Convention Secretary and Lillian Norman-Keeney, District Director:
