August 4th Mínutes

President Cindy Seidensticker called the August meeting to order at 12 noon. Shirley Hendrickson gave the invocation.

The Pledge to the American and Texas Flags was lead by former TFRW District Director, Anna Clair Rice. A.J. Kitchens, son of Mike Kitchens, played Amazing Grace on his recorder.

Teri Goodman verified 41 full and 35 associate members.

Minutes, Cont'd.

Diane Gillette, introduced speakers, Jeff Brennan, Commissioner of Brazoria Co., District No. 4; David Randolph of the Brazoria County Flood Control District; Mike Fitzgerald, Engineer with Galveston County, all of whom are sponsors of the Clear Creek Project. Brennan spoke in favor of the project. Don Johnson, a homeowner who lives along the creek and a member of the Citizens Advisory Committee on the project, spoke against federal intervention.

The regular meeting resumed, and Diane Gillette announced that Ginia Wray Wright, TFRW Programs, will be guest speaker at the September CCRW meeting. Minutes from the May meeting were approved. Treasury report was approved as printed in the newsletter and will stand for audit. A question and answer period followed.

Tommye Randolph gave a legislative report. Carole Ragland was recognized for her excellent work on the CCRW Handbook. Each member was given a copy. Until a volunteer is appointed, President Seidensticker asked that all volunteer hours be reported to her by E-mail or telephone.

CCRW will accept books for Devereux. The Board recommended a scholarship donation of \$200 be made to Bay Area Turning Point, which will be used to send a woman to school to learn a trade. Carol Ragland moved to approve, second by Barbara Meeks. Motion carried. CCRW will donate books to the League City Library for the Mamie Eisenhower and Barbara Bush Awards, at \$50 each.

Ginia Wray Wright, of the Galveston Republican Women, has submitted a proposal that Galveston host the Texas Federation of Republican Women Convention in 2009.

President Seidensticker announced Thursdays will be CCRW Day at the BARW phone bank, to help keep CD 22 Republican. "Talking points" will be emailed. She added that Committee Chairs are needed for campaign activities, voter registration, and CCRW Historian.

The meal price for September will be \$20 for the scholarship fund. An "Angel Jar" will be provided at the sign-in table for donations. There will be a silent auction to help raise CCRW campaign funds. The \$10 meal price may soon be changing.

The Board recommended a \$500 campaign donation for longtime member, Barbara Meeks, who is running for Galveston County Clerk. Motion by Diane Gillette, second by Kathie Nenninger. Motion carried. Barbara Meeks thanked the membership for their support of her campaign.

The next CCRW meeting will be September 1, 2006. With no further business, President Seidensticker adjourned the meeting at 1:10 PM.

Legislative Update

HOUSTON - Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison (R-TX), a member of the Senate Appropriations Committee, was joined by U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Secretary Alphonso Jackson to announce that the state of Texas will be provided \$428.6 million in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding. The CDBG funds will reimburse Texas communities for the costs associated with Hurricane Rita damage and the accommodation of 250,000 Hurricane Katrina evacuees who sought refuge in Texas.

WASHINGTON DC - President Bush signed legislation that resulted in a huge victory for the residents of San Diego, California, as well as Christians everywhere. The bill may seem insignificant viewed apart from the history that helped shape it, since it simply guarantees transfer of ownership of the Soledad Veterans Memorial from the local to the federal government. The history, however, is undeniably momentous.
