

From the President



Mínutes from May 2, 2008

President, Diane Gillette, called the May Clear Creek Republican Women's meeting to order at noon on May 2, 2008 at Esteban's Fiesta Shack in League City. Celia Mabry led us in prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and the Texas Pledge led by Senatorial District 11 SREC, Kathy Haigler.



Diane asked the elected officials and candidates present to stand and introduce themselves. Nine guests were introduced. Hillary Clinton once again interrupted our meeting and was played by Betty Suagee.

Diane introduced Vice President Programs, Barbara Meeks. Barbara introduced our guest speaker, Cathie Adams, President of Texas Eagle Forum.

The business meeting resumed. Minutes from our April 4 meeting that were published in the newsletter, were approved with no corrections.

The Treasurer's Report that was published in the newsletter had no corrections and will stand for internal review.

Officer and Standing Committee Reports:

- V. P. Membership Bettie Moss said that we have 3 new members and 2 new associate members, giving us 48 full members and 45 associate members. Our new members are Karen Sharpe, Eloise Taylor and Marlene Menchaca. Bettie reminded us that there is a membership competition for 2008 and that the prize will be a weekend at the historic John Kipp House in Kemah. Diane said that CCRW was congratulated and mentioned in the Texas Federation of Republican Women's newsletter for submitting OVER 100% of our 2007 Active Member numbers. She said that much of this success is directly related to the hard work and diligence of our VP of Membership, Bettie Moss. She then thanked Bettie.
- V. P. Programs Barbara Meeks announced that the she is still working on our August speaker.
- Treasurer Roxanna Lewis said that the treasury balance was printed in the newsletter.

Committee Reports:

- Campaign Activities: Kathie Nenninger said that she received an email from TFRW stating that we can count any hours that we work for our CCRW job but not the hours that we spend at the meetings. She will accept those additional hours for April. Kathie also told of the General Election Competition sponsored by Lt. Governor David Dewhurst from April 9 through November 5, 2008. Medium clubs like ours have the opportunity to win a \$1000 first place prize. The competition Award will be presented on Legislative Day.
- Legislation: Ruby Cubley from BARW announced that Harris County Republican Party would open a Victory 2008 campaign office in the Bay Area. On Saturday May 17th there will be a statewide block walk.
- Victory 2008: Bonnie Wilson said that there will be an organizational meeting next month and to watch for emails for volunteer needs.
- Community Outreach: Bettie Suaguee asked for donations for our scholarship that will be given to a graduate of Devereux. She passed around a basket for donations. Roxanna said that those who gave cash would need to fill out a donation form.
- By-laws: Carole Ragland presented the membership with the following two changes that will be voted on at our August meeting so that our by-laws can be submitted to TFRW by the October 31 deadline:

Article IV - Membership, Section 2. Active Member (adding the words in red)

To be eligible to vote in club elections, a member must have paid her dues at least 30 days prior to the election and must have attended at least one meeting.


Article VII - Dues Section 2. Membership Dues (striking through and adding words in red)

The membership dues shall be \$10 above TFRW and NFRW dues each year, payable January 1, and shall be delinquent March 1. For those joining in October, November, or December, dues for the remainder of the year shall be \$5.00 above TFRW and NFRW dues., dues shall be applied to the following year.

Old Business

Diane said that there are eight members who will attend TFRW's Tribute to Women luncheon on June 13 at the Texas Republican State Convention. Checks and forms were sent to the TFRW chairman on Tuesday.

New Business:

Diane said that TFRW encourages clubs to support women candidates who are members of their clubs and that the CCRW board recommended that we make a monetary donation to Constable Pam Matranga's campaign fund in the amount of \$100 to help defray expenses. Bonnie Wilson moved that CCRW give candidate, Constable Pam Matranga \$100. Barbara Meeks seconded and the motion passed.

Diane said that the CCRW board also recommended that we make a monetary donation to help re-elect the Honorable Cheryl Johnson who is running in a contested countywide election for Galveston County Tax Assessor/Collector. Due to the fact that this race is contested and county wide, the Board recommends that our Club donates \$300 to help defray expenses. Norma Byous made a motion that CCRW give Cheryl Johnson \$300. Bonnie Wilson seconded and the motion passed.

Announcements:

- Diane reminded everyone to vote in the City's General Election. Early voting continues today, tomorrow, Monday and Tuesday. Election Day is Saturday, May 10. Voting information is on the white board.
- Diane said that there would be training for delegates and alternates to the state convention at three different locations hosted by Senate District 11 State Republican Executive Committee Members, Kathy Haigler and Dennis Paul. Delegates and alternates should have received her email detailing the dates, places and times. A copy of the flyer on the white board.
- Diane announced that there is a sign up sheet to volunteer to register voters on May 24th at the Randall's in South Shore. She asked if members are a volunteer Deputy Voter Registrar to please make an effort to work a few hours. She passed out a sign up sheet.
- Diane said that there would also be an opportunity to register voters at the Texas Music Festival held next weekend, May 9-11 in League City at the park. Roxanna Lewis spoke about the booth that the Galveston County Republican Party will have. Cheryl Johnson said that she has bought a canopy and tables and that we could use them at events to register voters.
- New members were asked to stay today for a short informal orientation regarding our club and committees.
- Diane thanked Esteban's for the wonderful lunch.
- Diane announced that our next meeting will be at Esteban's on Friday, August 1 and that CCRW does not meet in June and July.
- Cheryl Johnson told of her tax classes and of the Tax Freedom Day celebration May 8th. Paul Bettencourt and Allen Fletcher, the newly elected State Representative from District 130, will be there. One of the auction items will be a weekend at the Trube Castle in Galveston. She will have another event at the Haak Winery on May 30th.
- Debbie Lindemann from BARW announced that the speaker for their meeting would be the Harris County Sheriff Department.
- Kathy Rogers said Galveston County Republican Party Chairman John LeCour, would be the May 22nd speaker at Friendswood RW. They will meet at Ziti's Restaurant in Friendswood.

Following the announcements, the meeting was adjourned.

Candidate Spotlight on:

Justice Dale Wainwright, Texas Supreme Court





Justice Wainwright's legal scholarship, integrity and conservative judicial philosophy has earned him the respect of Texans and Texas officials. In 1999, Governor Bush appointed Wainwright to the District Court bench in Harris County following over a decade in private prac-

tice. After two years as a district judge, Governor Rick Perry appointed Justice Wainwright to a six-month temporary commission on the Texas Supreme Court to help decide a case when a sitting justice recused from the case. Then in 2002, in an historic election, Wainwright became the first non-incumbent African American in Texas history to be elected to the Texas Supreme Court.

Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison has described Justice Wainwright as "one of the outstanding stars on the Supreme Court in Texas." The *Dallas Morning News* stated that he has been a strong voice for scholarly fairness. The *Austin-American Statesman* predicted that Wainwright has all the makings of a Texas political star.

In all the 2008 judicial polls – the State Bar of Texas, the Houston Bar and the Tarrant County Bar - the attorneys of this State have voted Justice Wainwright best qualified for reelection to the Texas Supreme Court by more than a two to one margin over his opponent in the general election.

As a public servant, Wainwright has served on the board of directors of the Houston Volunteer Lawyers Program which provides free legal services to persons who cannot afford them. He co-founded the Aspiring Youth Program in Houston, which expanded to eleven states and is now a national program that assists at-risk, inner-city youth in raising their aspirations and encouraging them to stay in school. In 1999 the Houston Lawyers Association presented him with the outstanding lawyer award.

Wainwright graduated summa cum laude from Howard University in 1983 and earned his law degree from the University of Chicago Law School in 1988. He studied at the London School of Economics in Great Britain in 1981 as the Luard Scholar.

Justice Wainwright's twin bed rocks are his faith and his family. He and his wife Debbie have three sons, Jeremy (20), Phillip (17) and Joshua (10). They are members of Second Baptist Church.

Justice Dale Wainwright is seeking re-election to the Texas Supreme Court.
