There is a national movement called "You don't speak for me, Cindy!" from Move America Forward. They are caravanning from all over the country and feature military family members who have loved ones serving in the war against terrorism in Iraq or Afghanistan. The rally, August 27th in Crawford is called "We support our troops and their mission". They hope to let the leftist and media know that America loves this President and our military. Please fly your American flag in support of our military heroes. Come to our meeting and bow your heads in memory of those who sacrificed on that fatal day 9/11 and bless the men and women who are insuring that it won't ever happen again.

Helping Americans Vote A Guest Column by County Commissioner Ken Clark

Galveston County received \$1.4 million from the State to implement the Federal mandate known as Help Americans Vote Act ("HAVA"). The County must implement the provisions of HAVA by January 1, 2006. All public entities are required to comply with HAVA, i.e., cities, M.U.D.s, school boards and water districts.

We are looking at putting one Direct Recording Device ("DRE") for handicapped and disabled voters in each voting precinct, along with an e-scan Ballot Box which will tabulate votes at each precinct. By combining these tools, we can still vote on paper ballots (to maintain a paper trail) while using technology, which will give us election results earlier.

This new voting system will require additional paid training from the County Clerk for election workers to administer the election and operate the DRE's, and may even change the procedures for running the election, such as polling place setup and removal, and possibly combined primaries.

We are finalizing the selections of these voting options now and hope to have a new system in place for the November 2005 constitutional election, and fully operational for the March 2006 primaries. If you are interested in participating in the training, please contact my office so we can put you on the list to be notified.

Legíslatíve Update



AUSTIN – State Rep Joe Nixon (Houston) accepted a comprehensive study of 2003's House Bill 4 and Proposition 12 issued by the Texas Tech Law Review. "I salute the Texas Tech Law Review and the researchers for the time and attention they invested in this project to examine the landmark reforms we passed in 2003," Rep. Nixon said. The Texas Alliance for Patient Access reports that lawsuit filings in most Texas counties have been cut in half since the passage of the 2003 reforms. That's great news for Texas doctors – and Texas patients.

AUSTIN – Agricultural Commissioner Susan Combs has launched Hometown STARS (Supporting Tourism and Rural Success). The matching fund reimbursement program is designed to help leverage the dollars available to rural communities to promote local tourism events, in turn boosting local economies and attracting new jobs and dollars. WASHINGTON DC – House Majority Leader Tom DeLay recently acknowledged that the basing of twelve Predator drones to Ellington Field will create hundreds of excellent, high-tech opportunities for Air National Guardsmen at Ellington, and it will ensure Ellington Field and the Guard remain vibrant, irreplaceable parts of life in this community. The Predators based at Ellingtton will provide the Guard an invaluable location to train and exercise with the planes for potential deployment elsewhere in support of our war on terror. What's more, the Guardsmen who do get this training will be able to help our global efforts from here at Ellington. The Guardsmen here will be learning to fight a global, 21st century war, and helping our nation to win it.

WASHINGTON DC—U.S. Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison (R-TX) recently addressed members of the University of Texas Board of Regents and representatives of the University of Texas Medical Branch at the Galveston National Lab Groundbreaking Ceremony. Sen. Hutchison was a leader in helping secure the federal contract for the UTMB lab. When the lab is finished, it will be one of the most sophisticated biomedical research facilities in the world and a key part of the NIH bio-defense program.
