GALVESTON COUNTY GOP CELEBRATES VICTORIES

2012 has been a whirlwind year for your local Republican Party! It has been a year of court-decided redistricting (both state and local), a record-breaking (and most unusual) Primary, and a year of election victories and losses. While we are deeply saddened over the loss of the White House and of House District 23, we are joyous for fifteen local victories.

This year Republicans gained four new seats in Galveston County; we were one of 23 counties to gain the Sheriff seat and one of 66 counties to gain a County Commissioner. In fact Galveston County has its first Republican Sheriff and the first Republican Precinct 1 County Commissioner! Statewide Galveston County was the only county to gain two District Judge seats! We can also celebrate an increase in voter turnout and a HUGE increase in straight ticket votes: from 30,347 in 2010 to over 44,000 this year!

Your Galveston County Republican Party worked diligently toward these victories! The GCRP mailed flyers to 24,000 Independent households, one of which also went to 16,000 Republican homes. Thanks to our successful fundraising efforts the mailers were sent at no cost to our Republican candidates!
