



October 9 Presidential Debate (town meeting), 9 PM EDT, Washington University in St. Louis, MO. Moderators: Martha Raddatz, Chief Global Affairs Correspondent and Co-Anchor of ABC's This Week and Anderson Cooper, Anchor, CNN. Format: Town Hall Meeting-Half of the questions will be asked by uncommitted voters selected by Gallup and the other half will be posed by the moderators based on public interest as reflected in social media and other sources.

October 19 Presidential Debate, 9 PM EDT, the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, NV. Moderator: Chris Wallace, Anchor, Fox News Sunday. Format: Six (6) time segments of approximately 15 minutes each on major topics to be selected by the moderator and announced at least one week before the debate.


