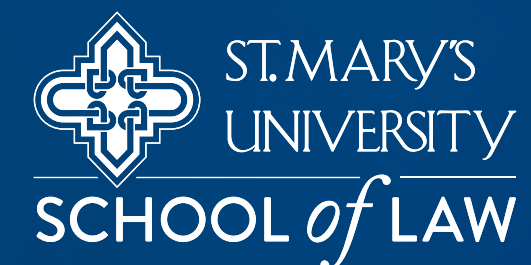

Lt. Colonel (US Army, Ret.) Jeffrey Addicott, J.D., LL.M., S.J.D., is Professor of Law and Director of the Warrior Defense Project at St. Mary's School of Law. He spent 20 years on active duty as an officer in the U.S. Army Judge Advocate General's Corps, and five years as a senior legal adviser to the U.S. Army Special Forces.

As an internationally recognized expert in national security law, he has delivered more than 1,000 speeches and participates in professional and academic organizations in the U.S. and abroad. He is a frequent contributor to national and international news outlets such as FOX News, CNN, BBC, New York Times, Wall Street Journal and Washington Post.
